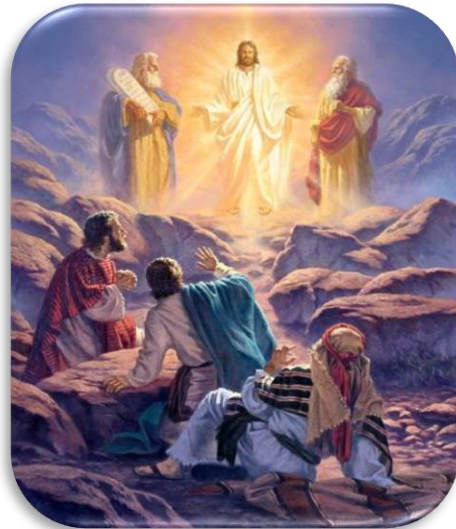

WORD OF LIFE

“Remember the moments of light”

“After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. (Mt 17: 1-2)

We have all felt illumined by God at some occasion. Sometimes it may have been through an illness, which made us reflect on the kind of life we were leading, as it happened to St. Ignatius or St. Francis. At other times a friend, or perhaps a priest, may have influenced us, and helped us realize where true happiness lies. It may even be that God has made

himself present in a special way in our lives through some extraordinarily difficult moment, or on the contrary, through a series of joyful moments. It is important that we realize that those “moments of light,” those moments in which we have felt God so close, are not only to be enjoyed the moment they occur, but are to be kept in memory and to be used when the opposite moments occur: those of darkness, those of pain, those of the experience of God’s silence. That is what Christ wanted to do on Mount Tabor with his friends, through his Transfiguration: to prepare them with moments of light for the moments of the cross. Let us discover this week, by exercising our memory, what are or have been the good moments in our lives: in our marriage, with our children, at work, with the Church, with our friends, with our parents, with the religious group to which we belong, with God. Let us evoke those old treasures to illuminate, with their light, the darkness of the present. Let us do justice to God by thanking Him for the good we have received, so that we do not only focus on our problems.

Purpose: *Remember the good moments to be more objective, more just in our relationship with others, especially with God. This way we will have fewer crisis.*

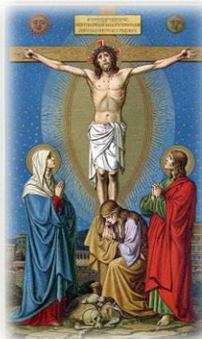

REFLECTION OF BENEDICT XVI

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

By following Jesus on the way of his Passion we not only see the Passion of Jesus, but we also see all the suffering in the world, and this is the profound intention of the prayer of the Way of the Cross: to open our hearts and to help us to see with our heart. The Fathers of the Church considered insensitivity and hardness of heart the greatest sin of the pagan world and were fond of the Prophet Ezekiel's prophecy: "I will take out of your flesh the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh" (cf. Ez 36: 26). Being converted to Christ, becoming Christian, meant receiving a heart of flesh, a heart sensitive to the passion and suffering of others.

Our God is not a remote God, intangible in his blessedness. Our God has a heart. Indeed, he has a heart of flesh; he was made flesh precisely to be able to suffer with us and to be with us in our suffering. He was made man to give us a heart of flesh and to reawaken within us love for the suffering, for the destitute.

Let us pray to the Lord at this time for all the suffering people of the world. Let us pray to the Lord that he will truly give us a heart of flesh, that he will make us messengers of his love not only with words, but with our entire life. Amen.

REFLEXIÓN DE BENEDICTO XVI

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Siguiendo a Jesús en el camino de su pasión, no sólo vemos la pasión de Jesús; también vemos a todos los que sufren en el mundo. Y esta es la profunda intención de la oración del vía crucis: abrir nuestro corazón, ayudarnos a ver con el corazón.

Los Padres de la Iglesia consideraban que el mayor pecado del mundo pagano era su insensibilidad, su dureza de corazón, y citaban con frecuencia la profecía del profeta Ezequiel: "Os quitaré el corazón de piedra y os daré un corazón de carne" (cf. Ez 36, 26). Convertirse a Cristo, hacerse cristiano, quería decir recibir un corazón de carne, un corazón sensible ante la pasión y el sufrimiento de los demás. Nuestro Dios no es un Dios lejano, intocable en su bienaventuranza. Nuestro Dios tiene un corazón; más aún, tiene un corazón de carne. Se hizo carne precisamente para poder sufrir con nosotros y estar con nosotros en nuestros sufrimientos.
